Position Summary:

The Swimming Assistant will assist in developing, organising and delivering safe, enjoyable, and high-quality swim lessons, as directed by the Head of Swimming and Swimming Teachers at St Pirans School.

Duties and Responsibilities:

Teaching & Learning

- To help create and manage a caring, supportive, purposeful, and stimulating environment which is conducive to children's learning
- To assist in the delivery of high-quality, differentiated lessons
- To aid in ensuring children are getting to their lessons to Extended Day and are having a snack (where appropriate) after swimming
- To assist in enabling pupils to develop positive attitudes to swimming
- To promote high standards of behaviour and discipline among the pupils, safeguarding their health and safety
- To ensure that school policies are reflected in daily practice
- To promote actively strong and positive relationships with parents and carers.

General Requirements

- To promote and safeguard the welfare of pupils you are responsible for and with whom you meet
- To maintain high professional standards of attendance, punctuality, appearance, and
- To conduct a visual risk assessment of the poolside and ensure it is clear and safe for swimming
- To assist with setting up and clearing away at the end of each session
- To maintain positive, courteous relations with pupils, parents, and colleagues

- To maintain good order and discipline among pupils and support and contribute to the school's responsibility for safeguarding their students
- To promote the good name and reputation of the School
- To adhere to School policies and procedures.
